## How to get there:

The Old Army Trailhead is located on the north side of McClelland-Stafford Ferry Landing within the Monument. The trailhead is approximately 2.5 hours from Fort Benton and 1.5 hours from Lewistown.

Volunteers are encouraged to camp nearby the night before to ensure a prompt arrival in the morning. Directions to the site can be found below or on Google Maps.

If you need more specifics, please feel free to reach out to us and we will help get you to the trail.

## **Directions from Lewistown:**

- -Take Hwy 191 N out of Lewistown for about 14 miles
- -Turn left onto Winifred Road/236 and continue north for about 22 miles
- -Continue onto the truck bypass for about .3 miles
- -Turn right onto Dy Creek and drive 2 miles
- -Continue north onto Stafford Ferry Road and follow for about 14 miles to McClelland-Stafford Ferry
- -Use the Ferry and cross to the north side of the river to reach the trailhead
