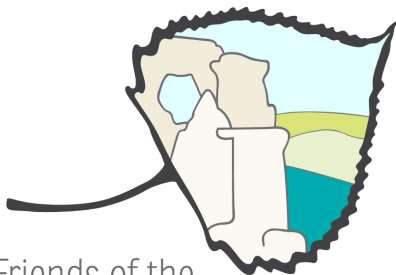

Field Season 2021

The field season is coming up quickly and we are looking forward to the many projects we have scheduled for this year. Mark your calendars and be sure to join us for what you can!

Ranging from our signature cottonwood planting project to interpretive center clean up days, our calendar of events has something for everyone to take part in.

Outside of our volunteer events, the Friends will also be taking on our usual responsibilities as caretakers of the trees in the Monument. This work includes watering all of the previously planted cottonwoods on a biweekly basis during the dry summer months to ensure tree vigor and increased survival. Additionally, a study of past plantings will be done to help us continue to improve our planting method moving forward.
